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## The Evidence Proving the Bible Is Inspired?

There are irrefutable evidences found for the inspiration of the Bible, both external and internal evidences. For instance, all of us can see the rainbow. When we do, we should remember the promise made to Noah just after the flood, that God would never again flood the world with water. There are also the changing seasons to consider. God promised Noah, "While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease" (Gen. 8:22). In the changing seasons we can see God's

faithfulness to His promises. This is also true with the tides of the ocean, by which you can set your watch, and which have certain boundaries to keep it from flooding the earth. And, it is still a fact that every seed produces after its kind, just as God decreed in Genesis. We would point the doubter also to the many prophecies made many hundreds of years before their occurrences, and yet each one occurred in minute detail (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:22-23)! And then, consider the universal endurance and popularity of the Bible. No other book, year after year through the centuries, the world over, has offered to man, and been acknowledged by men, to be the best way of living on this earth! Do you remember the Lord's promise about His Book? He said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away" (Matt. 24:35). And again, the apostle Peter stated, "But the word of the Lord endureth for ever" (I Pet. 1:25). Those who object to the Bible have never been able to offer us a book of better improvement or advantage! They never will! The Bible can be tested for accuracy geographically, scientifically, and historically, and it always passes the test!



# RON'S REMINDERS



Recently, the Supreme Court of our land made a misdecision regarding same sex marriage. But we as Christians are guided by the statement of Peter and the apostles found in Acts 5:29: "We ought to obey God rather than men." I thought when I started writing about sodomy that I would list all the scriptures found in the Bible dealing with this sin. There are plenty of pertinent scriptures in both the Old and New Testaments. Instead, I refer you to Matthew 19:4-6 in Jesus' own words: "And he answered and said unto them, Have ye not read, that he which made them at the beginning made them male and female, And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder."

It is redundant of me to cover ground in my amateurish fashion that has already been examined thoroughly in **THE SPIRITUAL SWORD**, Volume 44, Number 1, "They Parade Their Sin Like Sodom." Let me encourage you to read or to reread that issue. I was particularly struck by the editorial penned by Alan Highers, and I include the introductory paragraph of his editorial in my article:

Homosexuality is defined as a romantic or sexual attraction or behavior between members of the same sex or gender. The word "gay" is widely used to designate homosexual individuals or homosexual activities such as "gay community" or "gay marriage." The term *gay* initially meant "carefree" or "joyful." It developed in some usages to mean "without moral restraint." Beginning in the mid-twentieth century it came to refer to homosexuality in contrast to "straight," which denoted those who were conventional and not "gay." Some observers question whether the term "gay" is appropriate because there is controversy regarding whether the "gay lifestyle" can truly be characterized as "joyful" and "carefree."

One of the privileges I have from time to time is to write about brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone to their reward. One such person was Josephine Noah. To borrow a phrase from Marvel Comics, she was one of the "Fantastic 4." There
