Caesar and Christ

The question of whether Christians should be involved with politics is one we have struggled with for centuries. Many have concluded that Christians should not participate in politics or government in

any way. Some have even refused to vote, pointing to Jesus' statement, "render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Mark 12:17; Luke 20:25 ESV).

Other Christians argue that Jesus said this in response to a question about taxes and that Caesar represented an occupying government far away over which His audience could have no influence. As Abraham Lincoln put it, the United States was founded as a "government of the people, by the people, and for the people." In theory, at least, the people whom the government presides over are the same people who control the government. In this way, every American is a Caesar.

Our faith in Christ will be evident by what we say, what we do, and what we don't. As with the servants in Jesus' parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-30; Luke 19:12-17), we will be held accountable for how we use or don't use the blessings we've been given. "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil" (2 Corinthians 5:10). Even how we use or don't use our ability to vote matters to God.

As Christians, we know that the world is not our true home. Yet, we are still in the world and have been commanded to be godly influences upon it. If we see our vote as a Godgiven blessing, we will understand that great care must be used in exercising it.

Decisions made by political leaders have affected God's people enormously. We read examples in the New Testament of men like the Herods, Pilate, Felix, the Caesars and their impact upon the followers of Christ.

It is vital that we never see any political candidate as a perfect representation of Christian values. As Jesus said, "No one is good except God alone" (Luke 18:19). Cynical though it may sound, we are called on to choose between imperfect candidates when voting. With knowledge of issues, examination of candidates and study of the Bible, we can determine the best option. Consider a few pressing political issues facing America: sexual perversion, marriage, equality, abortion, standards of justice and decency. Which of these is not addressed by the Bible?

Our God is larger than any candidate, ruler or government. Christians should thank Him daily for being subject to His rule and the kingdom of His Son.
