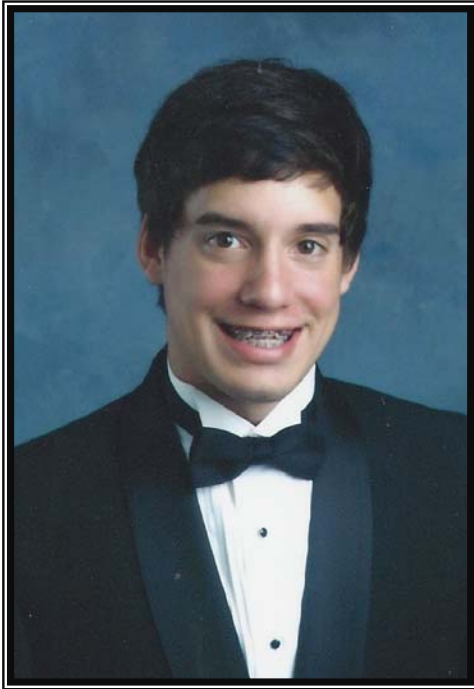
Where in the Bible Will I Find . . .

That the Bible Is an Inspired Book?

This is a worthy question which deserves our closest study. If the Bible is not inspired, it is not profitable, true, trustworthy, or beneficial to any in the world. It would rather be the biggest lying farce ever put off on mankind! We do notice that Paul wrote to Timothy that the Scriptures were inspired, which means they were "God-breathed." He said, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works" (II Tim. 3:16-17). With some the word "inspiration" is given different meanings today from the original thought of the Word that God breathed. Some speak of men being inspired because of environment, such as poverty and hard times which may cause thought to occur in poets and songwriters. This is not the inspiration that the Bible claims. Some speak of being "illuminated" by direct guidance of the Holy Spirit, as they read the words given in the Bible. Others contend for partial inspiration, where sometimes they are inspired, and sometimes they are not. These border on the shades of blasphemy concerning inspiration of the Bible. That "inspiration, from the original Greek word "*theopneutos*," "*Theos*" meaning God, and "*Pneustos*" meaning breathed, is God speaking His Will through chosen men, so that all who study His book may know and understand. Hence, the Bible is a written revelation or record of what God has spoken and is inspired (cf. Heb. 1:1-3; Eph. 3:3-5). About forty men, living in different times, in different areas, under different circumstances, were writers of the Bible. The sixty-six books they wrote make the one Book, the Bible, which stands without any serious conflict. How can this be? Only one explanation is sufficient to answer the question. One spirit caused it all to be written, and when it came together, it was and is one perfect or complete book (Jas. 1:25; II Pet. 1:20-21). We, therefore, urge all men to read and study the Bible in order to be wise, and to obey it in order to be safe. No other book in the world can make the claim the Bible makes and consistently sustain the proof!
