RON'S REMINDERS



Let The Beauty of Jesus Be Seen In Me

(Psalm 19:14; Galatians 2:20)

Is there a greater Biblical challenge than Luke 9:23: "If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, pick up his cross daily, and follow Me?" Probably not. For the beauty of Jesus to be seen in me, I must remove myself and submit to His superior will.

Apparently, John the Baptizer willingly took this task to heart when he said, 'He must increase, I must decrease" (John 3:30). In other words, as the song goes: "More of Him (Jesus), less of me; All of Him and none of me" (NLT) renders this text more succinctly: "He must become greater and greater; I must become less and less." This requires a willing exchange of control over one's life and character to that of Christ's.

The beauty of Christ must be reflected in how I interact with others. In Luke 22:31, Jesus told Peter, "When you are converted, strengthen the brethren." How do we do that? We strengthen the brethren by caring and sharing. Whether it is a need for prayer, guidance, friendship, support, Bible study, invitation to worship, etc., we show our beauty by being the example that Christ expects. Is there anything more precious to a person in need than an outstretched hand?

Let's face it, we are the extension of the work of Jesus Christ. He has no other plan. When we interact with our non-Christian friends and neighbors, and they fail to see any difference between us and themselves, or are confused as to whose we are, we have mishandled the task of presenting our Lord in His beauty.

As Christians, we should never be stagnant, rather striving for the prize each day (I Corinthians 9:24). Letting the world know that we serve the one true and living God must continue to be our primary focus. The twelfth chapter of Romans has always been the benchmark of godliness. It tells us that presenting our bodies as living sacrifices, is, at the very least, our reasonable or spiritual service. I do that by sanctifying my time and talents to God and feeding on His Word. The more I let Him in, the greater the transformation. The more I let go of the world, the more I grow. If I truly want to let the beauty of Jesus be seen in me, my life from this point forward—will start with love and continue demonstrating to the world the best version of myself until I have nothing left to give.

If Jesus truly has me, He owns my wallet, my love, my attention, my time, and my service. I will seek my brother's best interest and do nothing with self-only in mind; but in lowliness of mind, I will treat others as God has treated me—lovingly, patiently, with kindness. Friends, the beauty of Jesus in me inheres: an attitude of gratitude (Ephesians 5:20); a faith that obeys (Hebrews 5:8-9); a love that sees my brother's needs; a demonstration of sacrificial living (Luke 10:26-37); and a tireless but healthy love for well-doing (Galatians 6:9-10).

We know that Jesus Christ can take one person and change thousands of lives. Why not let that person be you or me? So, what are we waiting on? There is no better day than today!!

"Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then said I, Here am I; send me" (Isaiah 6:8).
