CAN YOU BECOME DESENTIZED TO DARKNESS?

Usually when a preacher mentions the things that I am going to mention in this article, he becomes really unpopular. But, as most preachers, we recognize the importance of what I am about to mention and will be able to bear such unpopularity, hopefully for only a short while. Most of this comes from an article I read in the Northside Anchor bulletin from Calhoun, GA. "Have we allowed our eyes to adjust to darkness?" by Ron Hall.

Many people have become desensitized to violence and abnormal behavior. It comes from movies, TV programs, social media, the internet, video games, and smart phones that all contribute to this mindset. Such desensitization leads to a moral break down in our society unseen by previous generations. One major, if not the primary, contributor to this behavior is the new generation of VIOLENT video games, i.e., Fortnite, Battleground, Apex Legends, Battle Royal, etc. One writer who covers media trends wrote: "You know Fortnite is incredibly popular. But did you know it's even bigger than some of this year's biggest blockbuster movies? Bigger than the NFL? Bigger than virtually anything on television in fact?" ... (Toni Fitzgerald Media Life). Studies show that violent video games are significantly associated with: increased aggressive behavior, thoughts, and affect increased physiological arousal; and decreased prosocial (helping) behavior ... (Anderson & Bushman, 2001). If we think that our kids, or adults for that matter, can fill their minds with violence/evil/dark entertainment, and it have no consequences, we are deceiving ourselves (Gal. 6:7-8).

Today's technology brings this darkness into our private spaces 24/7 via the internet, TV, smart phones, etc. Many are downloading this darkness right into our lives, and most times it's FREE! Well, then you are prompted to purchase all sorts of prizes and rewards. We are talking multi-billion dollar businesses. According to ESA, 2018 recorded a revenue breaking year for the gaming industry, with total video game sales exceeding \$43.4 billion. As the leading form of entertainment today, video games are an integral part of American culture (ESA Entertainment Software Assoc.). Sadly, many of these video games focus strictly on violence - the dark side. Dangerous for any group, but especially vulnerable are those between the ages of 12 to 18. According to a Wikipedia survey the far majority of these kids prefer the games rated "M" (mature) or "AO" (adult-only). NOTICE THIS POINT - The sad reality is that kids who spend any time playing these type games are gradually "adjusting to the darkness" and become desensitized to God's moral standards. Do you think it is any better for the adults? Parents, don't allow your children to spend their time filling their minds with such darkness. What did Paul say we should fill our minds with, (Phil. 4:8)? Once our children become comfortable with the darkness of this world they will become desensitized to what sin really is and its deadly effect on their social and spiritual lives. It will be much harder to bring them back to the light (God's moral standard) once their minds have been seared with darkness. What do our children become when you allow them to spend time in these dark places? Parents, don't allow your children to adjust to Satan's dark world. Don't let Satan win the battle for your children's souls. Keep them in the light (Gal. 4:16). Watch what our children are feeding upon. Jesus warned, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6:21). " ... For out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaketh" (Matt. 12:34-35). In the Bible. Identifying Marks of the Lord's Church: What Standard of Authority?

The New Testament is the only standard of the Lord's church in faith and practice.

In the first century church, there were no human creeds. The apostles were guided by the Spirit "into all truth" (John 16:13). They left us the fully revealed, written Word of God (Ephesians 3:3, 5; Jude 1:3). The early church "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine" (Acts 2:42).

No person is to add to the Word nor subtract from it (Deuteronomy 4:2; Revelation 22:18–19; 1 Peter 4:11). The omniscient God does not need man's input. His Word needs no revision (Matthew 24:35).

The Holy Scriptures are all-sufficient for man's salvation. "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16–17).

God's Word contains "all things that pertain to life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). Thus, there is no continuing revelation or direct operation of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of sinners or Christians today. The faith "was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 1:3). The Spirit operates today only through the Word, His sword (Ephesians 6:17). The gospel "is the power of God to salvation" (Romans 1:16).

We can understand the Bible, and we can understand it alike. Otherwise, Jesus would not have said, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32).

Some say, "You see it one way, and I will

see it another." However, this has the Bible teaching opposite things. Truth never contradicts. The Lord does not require some things of one person and contradictory things of another. "God is not the author of confusion" (1 Corinthians 14:33). Paul said that we should "all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (1 Corinthians 1:10). If we cannot understand the Scriptures alike, it would be impossible to obey this verse.

While abroad, a man from China purchased a powerful microscope. Returning, he looked at contaminated rice through the microscope and saw tiny living creatures crawling all over it. He did not like what the microscope revealed; rice was his favorite meal. What did he do? He smashed the microscope to pieces!

Johoiakim did not like what was revealed in God's Word. What did he do? He cut it with the scribe's knife and cast it into the fire (Jeremiah 26:23). Yet, the Word remained (36:28, 32). It remains today, "The word of the Lord endures forever" (1 Peter 1:25). We will be judged according to the Word (John 12:48).

If a religious organization holds some other book as its standard in faith and practice, or perverts the Truth, it is not the church of the Lord (Galatians 1:6–9; Colossians 2:8).
